- 6.4.2 When monitoring for a category A stressor levels outside of the boundary area the required recordkeeping requirements are identical to those listed in 6.4.1 with the following exceptions:
 - a. No personal protective equipment is required since the sampling is outside of the boundary.
 - b. If the stressor concentration is over the limit, corrective action must be documented.
- 6.4.3 When monitoring for category B and C stressors recordkeeping requirements are identical to those in 6.4.1 and 6.4.2b, although boundary numbers will not always be required as determined by the OSH office.
- 6.4.4 Category A stressor operations shall be monitored or visually inspected by Code 106.1 or 106.3 for post work disestablishment of boundary. The following records are required:
 - a. I Boundary number.
 - b. I Stressor name.
 - c. Review of post-work environmental samples (if any) and work area certification for compliance to the standard for the stressor concerned.
 - d. I Date of control area disestablishment.
 - e. Time controlled area disestablishment.

NOTE: These work process category records may be separate or combined as needed, but the minimum data elements must be available.

6.5 Training

- 6.5.1 All Shipyard personnel shall receive proper training in accordance with reference (a) for those operations which could or do generate stressor exposure levels in excess of their PEL or AL.
 - a. Formal training with a training plan shall be required for category A stressors. Formal training is at least one hour.
 - b. As with A stressors, category B and C stressors may require formal training or a formal briefing. The determination of the need for training or briefing will be made by the OSH office and identified in procedural control instructions.
